Good Neighborhood Management

Did you know...?

High Weeds and Grass

Grass or weeds over 12 inches high is a violation of the City of Bryan Code of Ordinances. High grass contributes to blight conditions, creates an insect and rodent harborage, and becomes a nuisance. It can also make grass fires more dangerous for fire fighters and homeowners. A fee will be charged to the property owner if the City has to mow the property.

Be a Good Neighbor!

Here are some of the ways you can be a good neighbor and help preserve the curb appeal of your home:

- Do regular lawn maintenance, including mowing your lawn, trimming trees and shrubs, and keeping flower beds weeded.
- Remove grass clippings from the street.
- Keep fences in good repair.
- Shed or outbuildings that can be seen from the road should complement the home in color scheme and have a shingle roof.
- Pick up after your pets.
- Garage sales are only allowed once every four months, and require a city permit. Take down your signs once the sale is over.
- Take down decorative holiday lighting at least 30 days after the holiday or event.
- Don't use the front of your home for storage.
- No boats, recreational vehicles or commercial vehicles may be parked in driveways or yards.
